Advent

First Sunday of Advent

Introit: To you, I lift up my soul, O my God. In you, I have trusted; let me not be put to shame. Nor let my enemies exult over me; and let none who hope in you be put to shame. *Psalm 25:1-3*

Second Sunday of Advent

Introit: O people of Sion, behold, the Lord will come to save the nations, and the Lord will make the glory of his voice heard in the joy of your heart. based on *Isaiah 30:19,30*

Third Sunday of Advent

Introit: Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near. Philippians 4:4-5

Fourth Sunday of Advent

Introit: Drop down dew from above, you heavens, and let the clouds rain down the Just One; let the earth be opened and bring forth a Savior. *based on Isaiah 45:8*

Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception

Introit: I rejoice heartily in the Lord, in my God is the joy of my soul; for he has clothed me with a robe of salvation, and wrapped me in a mantle of justice, like a bride adorned with her jewels. *Isaiah 61:10*

Christmas Season

The Nativity of Our Lord - Vigil Mass

Introit: Today you will know that the Lord will come, and he will save us, and in the morning you will see his glory. *based on Exodus 16:6-7*

The Nativity of Our Lord – Mass at Midnight

Introit: The Lord said to me: You are my Son. It is I who have begotten you this day. Psalm 2:7

Let us all rejoice in the Lord, for our Savior has been born in the world. Today true peace has come down to us from heaven.

The Nativity of Our Lord-Mass at Dawn

Introit: Today a light will shine upon us, for the Lord is born for us; and he will be called Wondrous God, Prince of peace, Father of future ages: and his reign will be without end. *see Isaiah 9:2,6; Luke 1:33*

The Nativity of Our Lord – Mass during the Day

Introit: A child is born for us, and a son is given to us; his scepter of power rests upon his shoulder, and his name will be called Messenger of great counsel. *See Isaiah 9:6*

Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

Introit: The shepherds went in haste, and found Mary and Joseph and the Infant lying in a manger. *Luke 2:16*

Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God

Introit: Hail, Holy Mother, who gave birth to the King, who rules heaven and earth for ever. *Sedulius*

Today a light will shine upon us, for the Lord is born for us; and he will be called Wondrous God, Prince of peace, Father of future ages: and his reign will be without end. *Is* 9:1, 5; *Lk* 1:33

Second Sunday after the Nativity

Introit: When a profound silence covered all things and night was in the middle of its course, your all-powerful Word, O Lord, bounded from heaven's royal throne. *Wis 18:14-15*

Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord – Vigil Mass

Introit: Arise, Jerusalem, and look to the East and see your children gathered from the rising to the setting of the sun. *see Bar 5: 5*

Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord

Introit: Behold, the Lord, the Mighty One, has come; and kingship is in his grasp, and power and dominion. *see Mal 3:1; 1 Chr 19:12*

Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

Introit: After the Lord was baptized, the heavens were opened, and the Spirit descended upon him like a dove, and the voice of the Father thundered: This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.see Mt 3:16-17

Lent

Ash Wednesday

Introit: You are merciful to all, O Lord and despise nothing that you have made. You overlook people's sins, to bring them to repentance, and you spare them, for you are the Lord our God. *See Wisdom* 11:24-25,27

First Sunday of Lent

Introit: When he calls on me, I will answer him; I will deliver him and give him glory, I will grant him length of days. *Psalm 91:15-16*

Second Sunday of Lent

Introit: Of you my heart has spoken: Seek his face. It is your face, O Lord, that I seek hide not your face from me. *Psalm 27:8-9*

Third Sunday of Lent

Introit: My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor. *Psalm 25:15-16*

— or —

When I prove my holiness among you I will gather you from all the foreign lands; and I will pour clean water upon you and cleanse you from all your impurities, and I will give you a new spirit, says the Lord. *Ezekiel 36:23-26*

Fourth Sunday of Lent

Introit:

Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast. *Isaiah 66:10-11*

Fifth Sunday of Lent

Introit: Give me justice, O God, and plead my cause against a nation that is faithless. From the deceitful and cunning rescue me, for you, O God, are my strength. *Psalm 43:1-2*

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Introit: Hosanna to the Son of David; blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, the King of Israel. Hosanna in the highest. *Matthew 21:9*

Holy Thursday (The Chrism Mass)

Introit: Jesus Christ has made us into a kingdom, priests for his God and Father.

To him be glory and power for ever and ever. Amen. Revelation 1:6

Holy Thursday

Introit: We should glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ,in whom is our salvation, life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and delivered. *Galatians 6:14*

Easter

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection

Introit: I have risen, and I am with you still, alleluia. You have laid your hand upon me, alleluia. Too wonderful for me, this knowledge, alleluia, alleluia. *Psalm 139:18. 5-6*

The Lord is truly risen, alleluia. To him be glory and power for all the ages of eternity, alleluia, alleluia. *Luke 24:34; Revelation 1:6*

Second Sunday of Easter, or Divine Mercy Sunday

Introit: Like newborn infants, you must long for the pure, spiritual milk, that in him you may grow to salvation, alleluia. *I Peter 2:2*

Receive the joy of your glory, giving thanks to God, who has called you into the heavenly kingdom, alleluia. *IV Ezra 2:36-37*

Third Sunday of Easter

Introit: Cry out with joy to God, all the earth; O sing to the glory of his name. O render him glorious praise, alleluia. *Psalm 66:1-2*

Fourth Sunday of Easter

Introit: The merciful love of the Lord fills the earth; by the word of the Lord the heavens were made, alleluia. *Psalm 33:5-6*

Fifth Sunday of Easter

Introit: O sing a new song to the Lord, for he has worked wonders; in the sight of the nations he has shown his deliverance, alleluia. *Psalm 98:1-2*

Sixth Sunday of Easter

Introit: Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard; proclaim to the ends of the earth: The Lord has freed his people, alleluia. *Isaiah 48:20*

The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord – Vigil Mass

Introit: You kingdoms of the earth, sing to God; praise the Lord, who ascends above the highest heavens; his majesty and might are in the skies, alleluia. *Psalm 68:33, 35*

Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord

Introit: Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia. *Acts 1:11*

Seventh Sunday of Easter

Introit: O Lord, hear my voice, for I have called to you; of you my heart has spoken: Seek his face; hide not your face from me, alleluia. *Psalm 27:7-9*

Solemnity of Pentecost – Vigil Mass

Introit: The love of God has been poured into our hearts through the Spirit of God dwelling within us, alleluia. *Romans 5:5; 8:11*

Solemnity of Pentecost

Introit: The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole world and that which contains all things understands what is said, alleluia. *Wisdom 1:7*

Ordinary Time

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: All the earth shall bow down before you, O God, and shall sing to you, shall sing to your name, O Most High! *Psalm 66:4*

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: O sing a new song to the Lord; sing to the Lord, all the earth. In his presence are majesty and splendor, strength and honor in his holy place. *Psalm 96:1,6*

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Save us, O Lord our God! And gather us from the nations, to give thanks to your holy name, and make it our glory to praise you. *Psalm 106:47*

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: O come, let us worship God and bow low before the God who made us, for he is the Lord our God. *Psalm 95:6-7*

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Be my protector, O God, a mighty stronghold to save me. For you are my rock, my stronghold! Lead me, guide me, for the sake of your name. *Psalm 31:3-4*

Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: O Lord, I trust in your merciful love. My heart will rejoice in your salvation. I will sing to the Lord who has been bountiful with me.*Psalm 13:6*

Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: The Lord has become my protector. He brought me out to a place of freedom; he saved me because he delighted in me.*Psalm 18:19-20*

Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Turn to me and have mercy on me, O Lord, for I am alone and poor. See my lowliness and suffering and take away all my sins, my God. *Psalm 25:16,18*

Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; whom should I dread? When those who do evil draw near, they stumble and fall. *Psalm* 27:1-2

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: O Lord, hear my voice, for I have called to you; be my help. Do not abandon or forsake me, O God, my Savior! *Psalm 27:7,9*

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: The Lord is the strength of his people, a saving refuge for the one he has anointed. Save your people, Lord, and bless your heritage, and govern them for ever. *Psalm 28:8-9*

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: All peoples, clap your hands. Cry to God with shouts of joy! Psalm 47:2

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Your merciful love, O God, we have received in the midst of your temple. Your praise, O God, like your name, reaches the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with saving justice. *Psalm 48:10-11*

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: As for me, in justice I shall behold your face; I shall be filled with the vision of your glory. *Psalm 17:15*

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: See, I have God for my help. The Lord sustains my soul. I will sacrifice to you with willing heart, and praise your name, O Lord, for it is good. *Psalm 54:6,8*

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: God is in his holy place, God who unites those who dwell in his house; he himself gives might and strength to his people. *Psalm* 68:6-7,36

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: O God, come to my assistance; O Lord, make haste to help me! You are my rescuer, my help; O Lord, do not delay. *Psalm* 70:2,6

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Look to your covenant, O Lord, and forget not the life of your poor ones for ever. Arise, O God, and defend your cause, and forget not the cries of those who seek you. *Psalm 74:20,19,22,23*

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Turn your eyes, O God, our shield; and look on the face of your anointed one; one day within your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere. *Psalm 84:10-11*

Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Turn your ear, O Lord, and answer me; save the servant who trusts in you, my God. Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long. *Psalm 86:1-3*

Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Have mercy on me, O Lord for I cry to you all the day long. O Lord, you are good and forgiving, full of mercy to all who call to you. *Psalm 86:3-5*

Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: You are just, O Lord, and your judgment is right; treat your servant in accord with your merciful love. *Psalm 119:137,124*

Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Give peace, O Lord, to those who wait for you, that your prophets be found true. Hear the prayers of your servant, and of your people Israel. *See Sirach 36:18*

Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: I am the salvation of the people, says the Lord. Should they cry to me in any distress, I will hear them, and I will be their Lord for ever. *See Psalm 37:39, 40, 28*

Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: All that you have done to us, O Lord you have done with true judgment, for we have sinned against you and not obeyed your commandments. But give glory to your name and deal with us according to the bounty of your mercy. *Daniel* 3:31,29,30,43,42

Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all. *See Esther 4:17*

Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: If you, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But with you is found forgiveness, O God of Israel. *Psalm 130:3-4*

Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: To you I call; for you will surely heed me, O God; turn your ear to me; hear my words. Guard me as the apple of your eye; in the shadow of your wings protect me. *Psalm 17:6,8*

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Let the hearts that seek the Lord rejoice; turn to the Lord and his strength; constantly seek his face. *Psalm 105:3-4*

Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Forsake me not, O Lord, my God; be not far from me! Make haste and come to my help, O Lord, my strong salvation! *Psalm 38:22-23*

Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: Let my prayer come into your presence. Incline your ear to my cry for help, O Lord. *Psalm 88:3*

Thirty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Introit: The Lord said: I think thoughts of peace and not of affliction. You will call upon me, and I will answer you, and I will lead back your captives from every place. *Jer* 29:11,12,14
